## Pianist - Johan Randvere

Charismatic and versatile, **Johan Randvere** is recognized as one of the brightest stars among the younger generation of Estonian pianists. Equally at home as a soloist and a chamber musician, he has performed in prestigious venues such as **Carnegie Hall** in New York and the **Great Hall of the Tchaikovsky Conservatory** in Moscow.

Randvere has given concerts across Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Finland, the Netherlands, Italy, Belarus, Russia, and the United States.

As a soloist, he has collaborated with numerous orchestras, including the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra, Tymen Philharmonic Orchestra, Pärnu City Orchestra, Belarus State Radio Symphony Orchestra, Estonian National Symphony Orchestra, Vanemuine Symphony Orchestra, and the Tallinn Chamber Orchestra, under the baton of esteemed conductors such as Kristiina Poska, Risto Joost, Toomas Vavilov, Grigori Soroka, Jüri Alperten, Erki Pehk, Mihhail Gerts, Sasha Mäkilä, Kaspar Mänd, and Jaan Ots.

Randvere has achieved notable success in both national and international competitions, including:

- 1st Prize at *Klaviermusik* (Vilnius, 2008)
- 1st Prize and Grand Prix at the Catania Music Competition (Italy, 2012)
- 1st Prize and Grand Prix at the Andrea Baldi International Piano Competition (Italy, 2014)
- 2nd Prize at the EPTA International Piano Competition (Belgium, 2014)
- 2nd Prize at the 8th Estonian National Piano Competition (2014)

A passionate chamber musician, Randvere regularly performs with some of Estonia's most distinguished artists. His **Randvere Piano Trio** received both the **Audience Award** and the **Special Award of the Holland Music Sessions** at the *Con Brio* festival (2010). Currently, he performs actively with pianist **Justas Servenikas**, **Trio Tempus Balticus**, and the Piazzolla ensemble **Nortango**.

Randvere studied at the **Tallinn Music High School** and the **Giuseppe Verdi Conservatory** in Milan. He is currently pursuing a **PhD at the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre**, studying under **Professor Ivari Ilja**.

In addition to his concert career, Johan is also a **television host** and presents a highly popular **radio program about pianists**, *Must klahv, valge klahv* ("Black Key, White Key"), on Estonian Classical Radio.
